Earth Day

April 22nd is Earth Day. This international day celebrates our remarkable planet. Earth Day is a reminder of the importance of environmental conservation and sustainability, encouraging us to take action for a healthier planet and brighter future for our children. **EARTHDAY.ORG** is unwavering in their commitment to end plastics, demanding a 60% reduction in the production of **ALL** plastics by 2040.



Back in September 2023, we launched our school year thinking about Pope Francis' letter 'Laudato Si' - a plea to humanity to care for our planet. In the autumn term our Mini Vinnies in Year 6 set up plastic collection boxes so that we can recycle plastic glue sticks and pens, and our Foundation stage started to replace plastic toys with natural products. These are small steps, but we need to do so much more! This week we ask you to consider the amount of plastic waste generated by packed lunches and try to reduce it by half. At home we can make a commitment by avoiding single use plastics and recycling responsibly.


