KOOTH - Self Harm

Self-harm is one of the top presenting issues for young people from the South-West who seek support from Kooth. There are lots of coping strategies on their website: <u>https://www.kooth.com</u>



Make your own coping box

Try using items around the house to help soothe or distract your child during difficult moments. Self sooth/coping boxes can help children get to a calmer place so there is an opportunity to think about options and choose a healthier way of coping.

Step 1

Find a box of any shape or size. E.g. an old shoe box. Your child can decorate it with colours, pictures or quotes that are important to them.

Step 2

Pick some things your child might like to look at, smell, touch or hear to go in the box or allow them to choose eq a teddy, a special photo, a favourite song list.

Step 3

Use the items in the box for as long as needed when things feel difficult, e.g. listen to the music, hug the teddy, look at the photo.

Step 4

Notice any changes in the way your child feels whilst using the box and write them down or encourage them to talk about their feelings before and after opening the box.


Handwriting
