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#### **Parent Teacher Consultations**

Parent Teacher consultation meetings take place twice a year, during the autumn and spring terms – there are also optional meetings following the annual school report in the summer term. These meetings provide a really important opportunity for you to discuss how your child is getting on in school and ways we can improve their learning outcomes. Please make sure you have booked your meetings this week on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> October and Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> October - the letter was emailed out to parents on 7<sup>th</sup> October.

#### **School Meals**

#### Parking on Devon Road

We are very concerned about the number of vehicles still driving up Devon Road to drop off children (especially those running late) and also vehicles pulling up on the pavement to park. This is causing a risk to pedestrians especially small children who drivers may not see running along the pavements or crossing the road.

Many children need reminding that they need to stick to the pavements outside the school rather than running across the road to the school gate – let's work together to keep our children safe.

#### Reception

After half term we will be encouraging the children in Reception classes to join the older pupils to walk through the main school gates in the morning and say goodbye to their adult there. Please trust us as we know this can be daunting for both adults and children, however children often relish this next opportunity to continue their independence!

### Be Safe

Over the coming weeks many families will be having celebrations which may include the use of fire in the form of candles, sparklers, bonfires or fireworks.

Please help keep everyone safe by:

- Keeping matches and lighters out of reach of children
- Keeping children away from candles, especially if wearing fancy dress which may not have the same fire safety standards
- Follow the fireworks code

#### Be Here, be Ready

We understand that when children are very unwell they should be kept at home as this is the best place for them to recuperate. Our usual gauge of being too ill for school is a high temperature or stomach upset. Common sense needs to be used when deciding whether or not a child is too ill to attend school. Parents need to ask themselves the following questions:

- Is my child well enough to do the activities of the school day? If not, keep your child at home.
- Does my child have a condition that could be passed on to other children or school staff? If so, keep your child at home.
- Would I take a day off work if I had this condition? If so, keep your child at home.

So not every illness will require a child to stay away from school, if your child requires prescribed medication 4 times a day we are able to administer this if the prescription label is attached to the medicine and you complete our Administering Medicine Form. While we have a dedicated team of first aiders at the

school, there are no qualified medical personnel, and facilities for looking after sick children are very limited.

If your child has had a stomach upset or sickness, it is important that you allow a period of at least 48 hours after the sickness or diarrhoea has finished, before sending them back to school. Such action will help to prevent the infection spreading unnecessarily to others in the school. This is in accordance with NHS and BCP guidance.

In all cases of your child being unwell and unable to come to school, telephoning the office and leaving a message on the dedicated absence line before 8.45am each and every day your child is absent will mean their absence is accounted for. The office staff will chase parents who have not phoned in confirming reasons for absence. Please do not see this as intrusive, we have a duty of care to ensure all pupils are accounted for which is required by the Government's safeguarding regulations. Please call the school office which has a dedicated absence line to report sickness absence daily.

Please leave the following information in your message:

- Your child's name
- His/her class
- Reason for absence
- Your relationship to the child

If we do not receive an explanation, or if the explanation is unsatisfactory, we will not be able to authorise the absence, and this will be shown on your child's attendance record. If you state that they are under the weather or unwell, we will call you to clarify.

If your child presents as unwell whilst in school their class teacher will send them to have their temperature taken by a first aider. If they have a temperature or are clearly unwell a decision will be made by Mrs Tickel or Mr Thomas as to whether parents/carers should be called to collect. In some circumstances you may be asked to pop in with some pain relief for your child. We will try our utmost to look after your child until you are able to get to school.

Please be reminded to keep us updated should your child's medical conditions change.

#### **Mermaid Tail**

**What is the Great Tail Trail?** More than 40 colourful giant mermaid tail sculptures will be creating a wave of excitement across Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole (BCP) in the spring of 2025 and raising vital funds for the Dorset children's hospice charity, Julia's House. We are joining in the fun by adopting and designing our own Tiny Tail sculpture, which will form part of the main art trail.

**When is The Great Tail Trail?** The Great Tail Trail will run for 9 weeks from 5 April to 1 June 2025, creating a free family-friendly walking trail through popular locations across BCP. You'll find mermaid tail sculptures along the coast and in the towns and parks around BCP.

# **Mission Moments**


