Message from the Headteacher

As we approach half term, we are grateful for all that has taken place in school over the past six weeks; the school trips and visitors, the liturgies and learning. We are especially proud of our Year 6 pupils who took their statutory assessment tests last week in reading, grammar, spelling and maths. We know that they all tried their best and hope that they all did well. The SATs are a snapshot of how well a child can perform on a single day – they don't define you! Our children are so much more then these tests. After half term, Year 6 continue with assessments in science, RE and writing. Year 2 SATs tests (we refer to this as 'special work') commence w/b 3rd June and w/b 10th June. Year 4 times table checks and Year 1 Phonics screening will commence w/b 4th June and w/b 10th June respectively. Children in all other year groups will complete end of year assessments in reading, writing, RE and maths and these outcomes will inform the content of your child's annual written report to parent; these are sent home in July. Remember your children need to be in school to achieve their very best! Please do not book holidays during this time – thank you!

May - the Month of Mary

We ask each class to start the day in May by saying the *Hail Mary* Prayer. Mother Mary is the patron of our school and for this reason we regularly beseech her to pray for us. This half term, Mrs Tickel's daughter will be taking prayer intentions from her home parish in Bournemouth to the grotto in Lourdes, France. We have included a prayer for St Mary's School and our community. Thank you to Year 1 pupils who led a beautiful liturgy in honour of our Lady on Friday 17th May – it was good to see so many family members there. This week more children will have the chance to bring in flowers to place in front of our Lady's statue or image.



In school we focus on a different Gospel Value and British Value each week. This week our Gospel Value (one of our 8 Bees) is **'Kindness'** and our British Value is **'Mutual Respect**'. Please do find opportunities to ask them about these values and how they have lived them out this week.

During our sports day events this week we are looking for all children to enjoy taking part and to develop a healthy attitude to sports participation, competition and good sportsmanship. There will be certificates for pupils in every class who have demonstrated good sportsmanship, and pupils will earn points for their house teams in the flat races. We look forward to finding out which house group will win the House Cup this

Reminders

The Importance of Learning Times Tables

Learning times tables is an important and fundamental skill. The importance and benefit of learning and memorizing times tables empowers your child to excel at mental maths. Through the gradual learning of times tables, your child will build up the knowledge of number rules, will make it less challenging to learn the more complicated times tables.



The memorisation of times tables will facilitate their mental maths as they will move from using concrete objects to visualizing the answers to questions. In addition, they will be able to solve addition, subtraction and division questions.

Not only learning the times tables, but the understanding will build your child's knowledge of other mathematical concepts, such as fractions and percentages. Confidence and knowledge of times tables benefits your child as they will be able to identify number relationships.
