

#### **ParentLine Confidential Text Messaging Service**

ParentLine is a confidential text messaging service providing parents and carers of 5-19 year olds in Dorset a way to seek advice from our school nursing team about their child's health and development via text message. Parents and carers can seek advice about a range of issues, including toileting, sleep, development, behaviour, healthy eating, mental health, bullying, school refusal and exam stress.



Parents and carers can contact the 5-19 ParentLine service from 9am-4pm, Monday to Friday (excluding weekends, bank holidays and school holidays), with a member of the School Nursing team responding to messages within one working day. If you send text outside these hours, you will receive an automated message with advice on where to get help if you need it urgently.

#### Value of the Week

**British Value of the week**: Mutual Respect – Pope Francis wants us to pray for those fleeing their country, that host countries are welcoming and show kindness and respect.

**Gospel Value of the week**: Kindness – as well as identifying what kindness is we use this as an opportunity to embed children's understanding that bullying is 'persistent' and ongoing acts of unkindness. They should all be able to discuss who their trusted adults are, who the DSLs are and what to do if they are worried.

### Be Here, be Ready

#### 100% Attendance Week this week!

This week we will remind families of the new regulations around school attendance which are coming into force from September 2024.

- From September, schools will have to consider a fine if a pupil misses 10 sessions (half days) of unauthorised absence in a rolling period of 10 school weeks. The threshold can be met with "any combination of unauthorised absence". For example, four sessions in term time plus six instances of arriving late.
- The period of 10 weeks can also span "different terms or school years".
- Schools "retain the discretion to issue one before the threshold is met". This could include where parents "are deliberately avoiding the national threshold by taking several term time holidays below threshold, or for repeated absence for birthdays or other family events".

Please consider the above if you are thinking about taking any holiday in term time in future.
