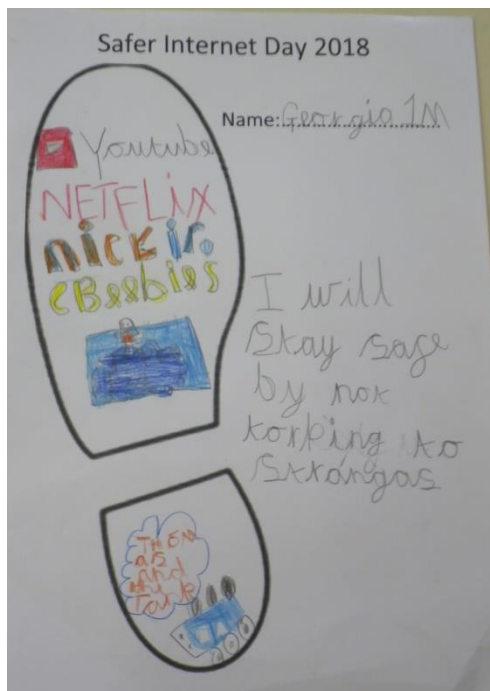




# Walk this way....

1. Check all your privacy settings. ...

3. Unsubscribe from mailing lists. ...
4. Register with a different email address. ...
5. Use stealth mode when browsing. ...
6. Think before you post. ...
7. Tor browsing. ...
8. Use anti-tracking tools.

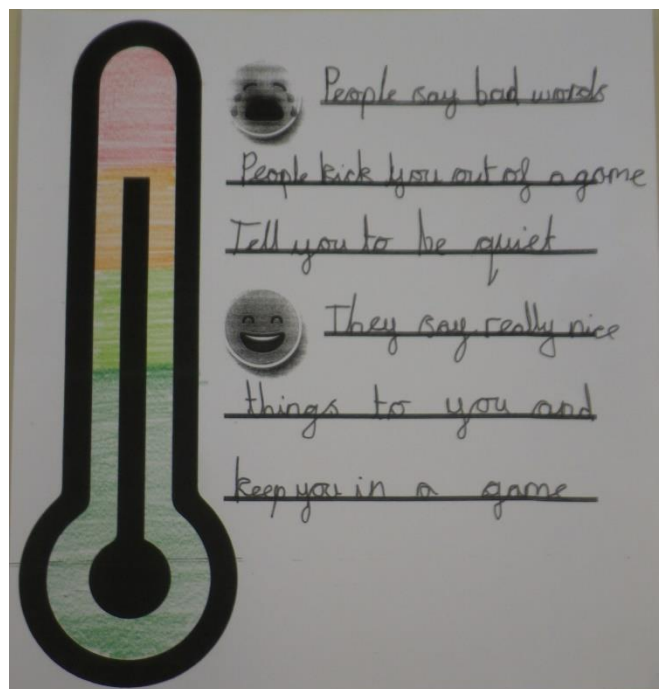
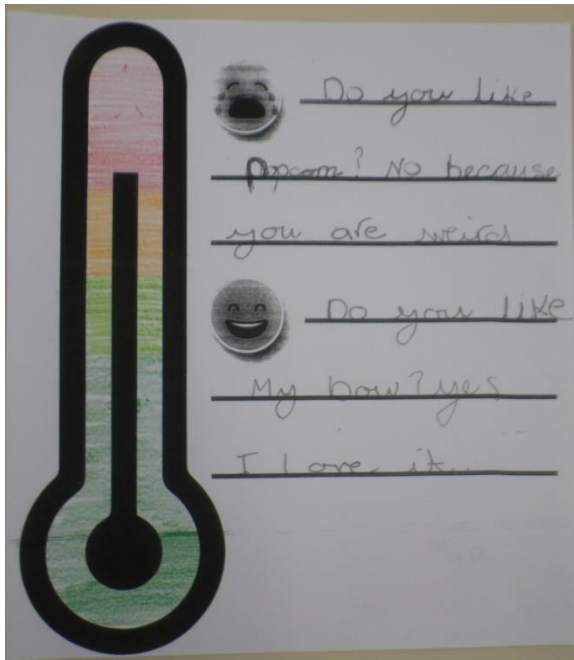

## **Interesting Facts on Digital Footprint and Reputation**

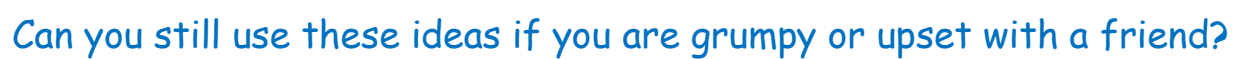
1. It is hard to keep a good digital footprint because everything you do online will never be deleted.
