The Feast of Christ the King is a feast in the liturgical year which emphasises the true kingship of Christ. The feast is a relatively recent addition to the liturgical calendar, instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI. It is celebrated on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time and thus ends the liturgical year. It typically marks the end of Ordinary Time, which continues up until Advent Sunday, the first day of Advent. The Feast of Christ the King this year takes place on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> November. This year we look forward to celebrating this feast in school on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> November.


