We can't believe that we are so close to the end of the school year and for our Year 6 pupils, the end of their primary school journey. In addition, you will be supporting the school with alleviating parking issues. We still regularly receive complaints from our neighbours about parents parking. There is also still an issue with parents are carers driving in to Devon Road and doing three (or more) point turns – please do not do this as it is extremely dangerous when there are so many children in the road.

Dogs - Please do not bring dogs onto the school grounds when dropping off or picking up children.

Term Time Holidays

This year we have seen a marked increase in pupils who have a term-time holiday. We appreciate the honesty from those who apply and use the correct process of notifying us and accepting that this may lead to a fixed penalty notice. As you know the school gets no benefit from the fine and we try and do all we can to ensure fairness and equality in the process. As a school we monitor attendance closely and discuss any concerns directly with you, so if we are concerned about the impact of an absence, we will discuss that with you.

As you will have seen in previous newsletters, there will be a change to the process going forwards that are worth highlighting again as you may be planning for next year. The government are increasing the cost of a penalty notice from £60 (per parent, per child, if paid promptly) to £80. The change also proposes a three-year period where any further holiday would lead to a fine of £160 per parent, per child. A third holiday is more likely to lead to a parenting order or prosecution. It is important to make you aware of the proposed changes so that you can consider them when planning for the future.
