Message from the Headteacher

Welcome back and I hope that you all enjoyed some quality time with your children over half term. This week we shall be focusing on our Lenten journey and how with God's help we can prepare for Easter. Here are some of the ways that we shall prepare for Easter:

- Each class will learn about the importance of Lent as a time of preparation and how we can use this time to help others and prepare ourselves for the celebration of Easter. We encourage children to either give something up or do something extra each day to help others. We will display our large cross in the entrance foyer and children will place a disc in the jars by the cross each day to show if they have done something to help another person. We can then reflect on how well we have done as a school in preparing ourselves for Easter.
- At the foot of the cross we will also collect food for our local food bank throughout the half term and items will be delivered each Friday morning. Please bring in items such as tins or packets of food if you are able.
- We will be taking part in the CAFOD 'Big Lent Walk' this half term to support CAFOD and those who are needy around the world. A separate letter and sponsor form will be coming home this week.
- We will have focused liturgies in school for the children including 'Stations of the Cross', reconciliation and a Lenten Prayer Space in our Chapel during the last week of term.
- Finally, we want to invite you to pray for our school community and each other during Lent.

A BIG thank you from our school council and for parents and pupils for supporting the non-uniform day we had on Friday 9th February. £211.80 worth of funds were raised to improve the environment outside our school, specifically by investing in recycling bins and bird feeders - Thank YOU!

Be Safe

There's no legal age that your child can travel home from school alone – this is up to you and our school rules and policies. At St Mary's we allow children in Years 5 and 6 to leave school on their own, all other children must be dismissed to a trusted adult.

You should never leave a child alone who isn't ready or is unable to care for themselves, every child is different. If you and your child do feel they're ready to come home alone, it helps to go over some rules about staying safe. The NSPCC suggests:

- Make sure they know their address and your telephone number by heart, in case they get lost or have to navigate home from somewhere new.
- If they have a mobile phone, remind them to fully charge it before leaving the house, and make sure they have all your contact numbers saved.
- Talk to them about road safety. They should always look both ways before crossing the street, and never be on their phone whilst crossing a road.
- Remind them never to accept a lift from someone they don't know, or let a stranger into the house. They should never give personal information away – in real life or online.
- Remind them that if they feel unsafe or uncomfortable at any time, they can call you or a trusted adult.
- If they ever feel like they're in immediate danger, they should call the police straight away on 999.

Be Here, be Ready

Our aim is to positively promote attendance at school so that each and every child can enjoy the very best education. It is really important that we continue to work together to do all we can to prioritise the children's attendance at school so that they can enjoy their learning and socialising with their peers.

Please be reminded that we are able to administer **prescribed** medicines, in loco parentis, providing you have completed the correct form which is available from the school office. Examples of when this may be appropriate are if your child suffers from stomach migraines and a painkiller has been prescribed on an "as and when" basis, your child is recovering from an infection and you know they are back to normal but have yet to finish a course of antibiotics and they need to be given 4 times per day. Please don't hesitate to contact us if you feel your child could be in school but are not 100% sure.
