Applying for St Edward's School via St Mary's Catholic Church

The requirement for seeking approval for a place at St Edward's School changed a couple of years ago from simply having done First Holy Communion, to a need to attend the church regularly. It is not for the priest to prove you are Catholic, it is for you to demonstrate it by your behaviour.

To do this and in particular, during Year 5, we ask the children of parish families to register on tablets at the back of the church whenever they attend Mass. This gives a record of attendance over the year and helps

the priest to sign the form with confidence and not feel he is being asked to tell a lie for someone who is simply trying to gain access to this oversubscribed school. Who would ask a priest to lie?

Forms are usually handed in when you attend your normal Mass and can be picked up after the Mass the following Sunday. If there is a problem, the priest may wish to meet up with you and your child briefly to reassure himself and will arrange this.

Nothing happens to forms before the closing date so being early is not an advantage! The parish secretaries have no authority over the forms and will refer you to this routine as the only response they can give.

Be Here, be Ready

Don't be Late Through the Gate!

As well as regular attendance at school, parents need to ensure that their child arrives at school in good time each morning.

School starts at 8.45 with the gates opening at 8:35. Being late on a regular basis adds up to a loss of learning time. If your child is late after the registers close 9:05 then they will receive a mark that denotes an unauthorised absence so they will miss the present mark for that session. It is embarrassing for children to walk in late to a quiet classroom and they may miss the input for the first lesson. Please help you child be organised and ready to learn:

- ✓ Uniform ready the night before
- ✓ Book bag packed the night before
- ✓ Packed ready first thing
- ✓ Reading book/record packed the night before
- ✓ Screen time limited during the evening and stopped in the hour before bed. It's best to keep phones and other digital devices out of bedrooms at night
- ✓ A good night's sleep

There are occasions when things can get stressful, things go wrong, or unforeseen circumstances can cause a family to be a few minutes late. However our role, in partnership with parents, is to also prepare pupils for the next step in their school careers and beyond. This means young people need to value the importance of being on time.
