Reminders

Bring a Coat - We still have children coming to school without a coat – as the weather cools please ensure they bring a coat this week for outdoor activities.

No Peanut Policy - Please remember, we are a peanut-free school to protect those with allergies.

Earrings - Please be reminded that earrings must be removed or taped over on PE days, school staff are not allowed to do this so your child should be competent. Thank you for your support.

Be Safe

In 2024, WhatsApp lowered the age rating in Europe from 16 to 13. This change received criticism from Children's Rights Advocates, who argued that the changes expose children to potential online harms. This change means that more primary school aged children are accessing WhatsApp than ever before. We have noticed that children at St Mary's are part of WhatsApp groups despite the age limit being 13 years old.

This presents a number of issues for our children:

- The pressure to conform to standards of attractiveness, that are the result of manipulated images, is huge and damaging to both boys and girls.
- Cyber bullying is so easy to hide online. There's no escape from it. There is no safe space for your child once it has started.
- Mediating between pupils who have posted hurtful comments, or pointedly removed one person from a chat group, takes staff time and whilst we try very hard to stop horrible messages being sent when the children are outside school, we can only do so much.

Please support your child by not allowing them access to WhatsApp!

It is incredibly important for parents to have open and honest conversations with their children about social media, so that they will talk to you if something bad happens. Please do not hesitate to ask us for help and support should you find that your child has had a bad experience online.

Be Here, be Ready

Please remember that regular attendance is key to your child's success. We kindly ask that you avoid booking holidays during term time to ensure they don't miss out on valuable learning.


You may have recently received a letter regarding your child's attendance during the previous academic year; please be aware that this was intended to be supportive to make you aware of your child's percentage as the school year ended. We hope that this year, with the new regulations around holidays, that the school's overall attendance headline figures will improve and, more importantly, children will be in school and learning.

Our whole school attendance currently is 96.5% so we are just ahead of the Government's minimum attendance target of 96%.

Reading at Home Matters!

Please take time this week to listen to your child read and also to read to them a favourite story.



Five reasons to read more:

1. **Reading builds vocabulary and language**: it exposes children to new words, phrases and ways of expressing ideas.

2. **Reading enhances imagination and creativity**: through stories children can explore new worlds, characters, and situations, sparking their creativity and imagination.

3. **Reading improves concentration and focus**: regular reading helps develop the ability to focus for longer periods, which is important for learning and everyday tasks.

4. **Reading boosts academic success**: strong reading skills are important for all subjects, from maths word problems to understanding science concepts.

5. Reading develops empathy and emotional intelligence: reading stories helps children understand different perspectives and emotions encouraging empathy and social awareness.

If children enjoy reading, then it will become a life-long habit!
