Message from the Headteacher

Year 5 had an enjoyable few days at Leeson House in Purbeck last week. The weather was mild and sunny; the children enjoyed their trip to Studland beach, a walk to Dancing Ledge and other activities, including a night walk. We are working hard to keep the cost of school trips to a minimum as this ensures the trips are accessible to all pupils. We are finding it harder to staff trips with budget cuts nationally and many can only go ahead with parent volunteer support and payment from the majority of families. Even where we use a coach for transport instead of our minibuses, we maintain trip prices lower than many local schools. Well done to our Year 5 pupils for their impeccable behaviour and to all the staff who cared for them so well.

Year 1 and Foundation have also enjoyed trips recently. Year 1 went to Upton Country Park where they learnt about the wildlife and seasonal changes. Foundation had a sunny walk to Oakdale Library last week where they looked out for different types of houses, spotted bus stops and post boxes etc, the library team helped the children foster a love of books and reading.

Earth Day: On Monday 22nd April Earth Day was celebrated across the world. At St Mary's some of the activities that the children took part it were, wild flower planting, switching lights off when not in use, exploring google earth and creating artwork to raise awareness.

Be Safe

News items often report the dangers of radicalisation of young people especially when current events such as pandemics or wars lead people to question what is happening around them. We know that those with extremist ideologies seek to exploit this confusion and use it as a way to recruit young people. One of the best ways you can help keep your children safe from extremism is to talk about values that challenge extremist ideology. These values are shared by many countries in the free world but in school we refer to them as 'British Values'. WE will talk to the children about DRIM (Democracy, Rule of law, Individual Liberty and Mutual respect and tolerance) and how it is good to live in a country that holds these values. You could talk to your child about times when they have choices in life, how rules that everyone follows keep them safe, about how they have the right to challenge other opinions and how everyone deserves respect because they are a human. If children are aware of all of this, they are much more unlikely to adopt an extremist ideology.

Be Here, be Ready

Prompt Arrival at School

The school gates open at 8.35am and close at 8.45am.

Your child's teacher is waiting at their classroom to welcome them; they start teaching at 8.50am after registration at 8:45am. Children arriving after this time must enter via the front office as their classroom doors will be closed. Your child must be signed in to ensure all children in school are accounted for.

No Car Zone

There has been a marked increase in the number of children rushing into school after 8.45am and this is linked to an increased number of parents dropping their children off and driving up Devon Road. We have asked that the cul-de-sac is a **no car zone** in the mornings, and the afternoons, unless cars have permission to enter the car park. Turning your car in the cul-de-sac in front of the school where children are walking is not an option; it is dangerous as a child under 10 is not always able to see over a car's bonnet.

100% Attendance Week

Each child's attendance should be 95%+ Any attendance below this is monitored carefully and referred to our education attendance officer, Mrs Hammond-Forge.

Our aspiration target is 97% at St Mary's, we think attendance is extremely important! Attending school helps children to prepare themselves for the rest of their lives. The higher the attendance, the more opportunity for success! The class with the highest attendance this week was 6L.
